

APPLICANT'S REQUEST TO EXCEED PAGE LIMITATION

Applicant Private Fuel Storage L.L.C. ("Applicant") is considering filing a motion for reconsideration and clarification with respect to certain aspects of the Memorandum and Order (Rulings on Standing, Contentions, Rule Waiver Petition, and Procedural/Administrative Matters) issued by the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board ("Board") April 22, 1998. In accordance with the Board's April 22 Order and its earlier Memorandum and Order of February 2, 1998 (Memorializing Initial Prehearing Conference Directives), the Applicant requests the Board's approval to exceed the ten page limitation with respect to any motion for reconsideration and clarification that it may file with respect to the April 22, 1998 Order. The Applicant is still reviewing the Board's Order and does not know exactly how many pages it may require for such a motion, but believes that an extra ten pages, or twenty page total, should be sufficient. Accordingly, the Applicant requests the Board that it be allowed to file a motion for reconsideration and clarification with respect to the Board's April 22, 1998 Order of up to twenty pages.

Applicant has called counsel for the State of Utah, Castle Rock, OGD and the Skull Valley Band and none of these parties objects to the Applicant filing an additional ten pages with respect to any motion for reconsideration and clarification that it may file with respect to the Board's April 22, 1998 Order. Applicant also attempted to contact counsel for Confederated Tribes to ask his position on this request but was unable to reach him. Also, Applicant informs the Board that it does not object to the State of Utah's request to file an extra ten pages, or twenty pages total, with respect to its motion for reconsideration of the April 22, 1998 Board's Order. Counsel for the State had attempted earlier today to contact Applicant's counsel but was unable to do so prior to the filing of the State's request to exceed the page limitation.

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
