(Granting Time Extensions  
for Discovery Responses and  
Contention Utah K  
Summary Disposition Motion)

Upon consideration of (1) the May 21, 1999 joint motion of applicant Private Fuel Storage, L.L.C., (PFS) and the State of Utah (State) requesting an extension of time for each party to file responses to pending discovery requests relating to the Group II and Group III contentions; and (2) the State's May 25, 1999 motion requesting an extension of time for (a) the State and PFS to respond to pending discovery requests relating to the Group I contentions, and (b) PFS to file a twenty-page partial summary disposition request regarding contention Utah K, and there being no opposition to either motion, it is

ORDERED, that the May 21, 1999 PFS/State joint motion for an extension of time to file responses to pending Group II and Group III discovery requests is granted in that those responses shall be filed on or before Friday, June 18, 1999; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that the May 25, 1999 State motion for an extension of time for the State and PFS to file responses to pending Group I discovery requests is granted in that those responses shall be filed on or before Friday, June 4, 1999;<sup>1</sup> and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that the PFS request for an extension of time to file a twenty-page brief in support of a partial motion for summary disposition regarding contention Utah K is granted and PFS shall have up to and including Monday, June 7, 1999, within which to file a summary disposition

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<sup>1</sup> Further, in light of the apparent relationship between the pending April 30, 1999 State motion to compel a PFS response to the State's April 9, 1999 discovery request regarding contention Utah C and the April 21, 1999 PFS summary disposition motion regarding Utah C, if appropriate the Board may provide a limited additional period for discovery on contention Utah C following its ruling on the PFS dispositive motion.


