Dear Mr. Lohaus:

I wish to clarify our July 13, 2000 letter. In the percentage allocations of employee time, I have allocated 40% of my own time to AEA Management Review of Licensing, giving a total of 90 days. Only 40 days are actually allocated to management review in the resource analysis. This leaves 50 days unallocated. These days will be used as necessary for licensing. Since I have attended all the relevant training courses, and am experienced in the program, I will be able to work on any licensing tasks as necessary. This will provide more licensing depth for the program.

In the event we encounter serious problems keeping up with licensing, I would undoubtedly be able to devote additional time to the area. The most likely source for this would be the time spent on non-AEA activities.

It is also important to note that Steve Hoggard is expected to attend the Licensing Course in late Summer (prior to the expected date of the Agreement). Soon after the Agreement takes effect he will probably become qualified to license Basic AEA licenses. By this time, our new hire will be able to assume many non-AEA duties from Mr. Hoggard, freeing up time for Hoggard to spend on AEA licensing duties. This will give further relief to Ms. Bishop and Mr. Fernandez. Similarly, Jerry Matthews will probably become qualified to inspect nuclear medicine facilities sometime in early 2001. Again, this will provide more depth to the program.
