Section 3.2 of the Environmental Protection Plan (Appendix B of Diablo Canyon Power Plant's operating license) specifies that changes and additions to the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit shall be reported to the NRC within 30 days following the date the change is approved.

Enclosed is a letter PG&E received on July 5, 2000, from the California Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) that delayed the due date for submittal of the annual receiving water monitoring report to September 30, 2000, to allow the RWQCB to resolve issues regarding appropriate statistical analysis. Per your discussions with staff, this letter extends the due date for the PG&E's 1999 annual receiving water monitoring report to September 30, 2000. The extended due date should allow resolution of issues regarding appropriate statistical analyses.

Also, we have held PG&E's 1999 "Best Management Practices Plan" for Diablo Canyon in abeyance pending resolution of the overall thermal effects and entrainment issues. However, that Plan should not affect the overall resolution process and is therefore approved.
