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

SUMMARY OF MANAGEMENT ACTIONS

January-June 2000

General Information

During the first 6-month period of 2000, the average population granted unescorted access was 1562 individuals. A total of 518 random drug tests were performed, which yielded a year-to-date random testing rate of 33.2% at the close of the 6-month testing period.

During the 6-month reporting period 1022 collection samples were tested. Nine of the samples were confirmed positive for illegal substances or alcohol and two were confirmed positive for the presence of adulterants. Including the adulterated samples, the testing failure rate (% positive) was 1.08%.

There were no for-cause drug tests performed during the 6-month reporting period.

One Entergy employee returning from short-term disability provided a pre-access adulterated urine sample. A second sample taken under direct observation tested positive for an illegal substance. This employee was terminated.

Four contractors provided pre-access urine samples that tested positive for illegal substances. Three of the contractors tested positive for two separate illegal substances. These individuals were denied access.

One contractor provided a pre-access positive breathalyzer test for alcohol. A subsequent blood sample also tested positive. Another contractor provided a pre-access adulterated urine sample. A second sample taken under direct observation tested negative. Both individuals were denied access.

Program Initiatives

During this reporting period the Fitness-for-Duty and Access Authorization departments merged. This was the result of an overall Entergy Operations Inc. reorganization that was recently completed.

Offsite drug screening by an independent laboratory began in January and was fully implemented by May 2000.

The NRC Performance Indicator methodology commenced in 2000. Preliminary steps to implement proposed changes to 10CFR26 are continuing.

An assessment of the effectiveness of detecting the "Stealth" adulterant is in progress.

Appeals

There were no appeals or requests for a retest during the 6-month reporting period.

NRC Reportable Events

There were no fitness-for-duty events that met the NRC 24 hour telephonic reporting requirement.
