



An experimental version of the *FAU Corsair* first flew in May of 1940. It was the first American fighter to exceed 400 mph. The Corsair played an important role in the Battle of the Solomon Islands, the invasions of Gilbert, Ellice and the Marshall Islands, as well as the retaking of the Mariana Islands and the invasions of Iwo Jima and Okinawa.
