Dear Mr. Meyer:

I am writing to express my concern regarding the Private Fuel Storage L.L.C. (PFS) license application with the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission to build and operate a commercial, centralized, away-from-reactor, high level nuclear waste storage facility on the Skull Valley Band of Goshute Indian Reservation, Utah. Although I fully recognize the difficulties surrounding nuclear waste storage and the need for a safe location, I am concerned about several aspects of the proposal.

First, although a temporary storage facility is an appealing idea, in reality, the facility is unlikely to remain temporary. Once nuclear waste has been stored there, the incentive to situate a long-term storage facility would dissipate. I am concerned that this prospect has not been taken into account in the consideration of this site.

Second, such a temporary site would necessitate additional transportation of high level nuclear waste. I realize that in some cases, waste must be transported. However, the addition of a temporary storage facility inserts an extra leg into the trip the waste must make on the way to permanent disposal. With the risks posed by transportation, I consider this to be an unacceptable gamble.

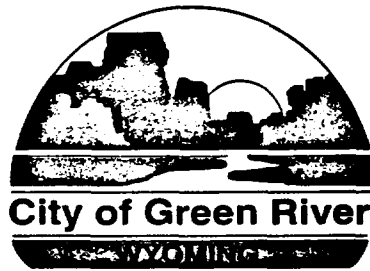

We would ask that careful consideration be given to this proposal and that a public hearing be held in our community informing our citizens as to the health and safety issues.



I oppose the opening of the Goshute Skull Valley Nuclear waste storage facility. This issue bears enormous significance and will negatively impact the state of Utah. Our citizens deserve reasonable public accessibility to the DEIS, Draft Environmental Impact Statement (a 500 page technical document). The public and the business community need extended time to review the DEIS, bring public awareness to the issues, and create dialogue for citizens questions. This licensing process has failed to disclose pertinent information regarding emergency preparedness, risk factors on the transportation corridors and financial information needed to assure stability for this long-term nuclear waste facility. This information is needed to further Utah's position regarding the citizen's health, welfare and safety. If Utah cannot be provided this information, the NRC must deny licensing of this facility. I support the "No Action Alternative".

I am deeply concerned and opposed to the proposed temporary storage of nuclear waste at the Goshute reservation within the State of Utah. I believe the following four points are valid conclusions to the ongoing debate.

a. Twenty year "temporary" storage in Utah will in actuality become permanent storage.

b. The nuclear waste proposed for storage in Utah should remain on site until the U.S. Government constructs and puts into operation a permanent storage site.

c. The U.S. Government should immediately finish the Yucca Mountain permanent Nuclear Waste storage site.

d. Nuclear waste storage cannot be allowed to hamper in any way the operation and safety of the U.S. Air Force Bombing & Test Range located in Utah's western desert. Negotiation or risk assessment of this principle are not options for debate.

I have no reason to disbelieve

the past transportation record for the movement of Nuclear waste as described by Susan Front. Shankman of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission. However, past performance does not predict future events. Accidents can and will happen over time. Risk is always present.

My case in point is the Concord aircraft. The fleet of Concord's safety record was the best of all commercial aircraft fleets. However a tragic accident still occurred. Past statistics did nothing to predict or prevent the accident.

A Mr. Bill Peterson has been quoted as saying, "The public doesn't completely understand the process of storing spent fuel." I agree with him. However we do understand that accidents can and do happen. My case in point. We do not understand the process for destroying chemical weapons at the U. S. Army facility located at Tooele, Utah. We were told by expert scientists and engineers that it was a completely safe operation. However, there has been several poisonous gas leaks at the facility. The latest gas leak has caused the facility to be closed since May 1990.

Remember, accidents can and do happen. We just don't have the capability to predict their precise time,

their exact location, or their severity when one does occur.

I request that I receive a copy of the draft DEIS (Docket NR. 72-22) so I can learn more about the total process. Also, since additional points have recently been raised i.e. the Hill Air Force Base / Test and Bombing Range issue, you must extend the deadline for public review comment on the DEIS. We also need more public hearings, in Utah, on this subject.

Letter to the editor in Morgan, Utah-September 1, 2000

I don't like admitting to the whole community that sometimes I hide my head in the sand on important issues that hit my panic button. Quite some time ago--I partially heard something about Utah being considered for the site of the nations nuclear waste storage facility somewhere out by Tooele. I dismissed the idea thinking that we had enough potential problems just with the nerve gas facility in our back yards (with a moderate wind)...and tried to optimistically assume Utah would never let this happen. Part of having my head buried means that I do not read the big city newspapers, and only occasionally--half way listen to the news. It helps this ostrich to be more positive about things. Last week a fax came to the real estate office where I work as an assistant office manager--about the nuclear waste issue. It sounded to me as if Governor Levitt's efforts along with the Citizens Against Radioactive Waste In Utah (honorary board members like Governor Norman Bangerter, Mayer Ted Wilson, etc...) were at a dead end and about out of time. What really got my attention was when I read that about 92% of all the nations nuclear waste is generated east of the Colorado River, and that one of the main routes by rail would be right through our beautiful little valley on the way to the Goshute Indian Reservation. There are numerous things that come to mind instantly...most of us live maybe a quarter mile at most from those tracks—what about derailment, how safe, etc... The biggest thing that bothers me is that it seems like the people that generate nuclear waste should be responsible for storing it, or consider other means of energy. The Citizens Against Radioactive Waste In Utah were asking any concerned Utah Citizens to get a voice with them in opposition to this, or at least to have more time to evaluate this sensitive issue. If anyone would like to sign a petition to let these independent energy companies know we are not in favor of this, and that we would like more answers to their plans—please look for a petition during the next few weeks at

different locations. There will be a petition at Nebco for anyone doing business there or passing by, also in the lobby of the post office, and at times there will be a table set up at the Jubilee market or petitions left on the bulletin boards. All comments and petitions have to be received by September 21st , and hopefully we can help make a difference. Thank you to a great community.

**Dear Judge Bollwerk:**

**We are writing to protest the proposed plan by Private Fuel Storage to "temporarily" store high level nuclear waste fuel rods on the Goshute Reservation in Skull Valley in Utah. We wish to express in the strongest possible terms that this proposal should not be approved.**

**Understanding that the fuel rods must be stored somewhere, we feel in Utah's west desert, we have already accepted more than our share of hazardous waste. The area currently houses two chemical weapons incinerators, two hazardous waste landfills, a radioactive waste landfill, the nation's largest toxic air polluter (MagCorp) and a massive bombing range about the size of Rhode Island. Enough is enough!**

**We feel that the Draft Environmental Impact Statement does not adequately address the following concerns:**

- 1. Earthquake and seismic evaluations are excluded from the DEIS. What would happen to these hazardous waste products if an earthquake (a Utah reality) were to strike the area?**
- 2. Wildfire danger, including fires sparked by train operations in Skull Valley, has received inadequate evaluation. We are told that Tooele County (the location of Skull Valley Reservation) has only a volunteer fire department and the closest team qualified to respond in the event of such a disaster would be in California. What would be happening to the citizens of Utah before such a team arrived, and once it did, what damage would we already be exposed to?**
- 3. The storage casks are not designed for long-term storage, yet they would be housed in Utah for at least 40 years. What if the Yucca Mountain, Nevada permanent repository fails to open? Severe scientific problems have been found with the Yucca Mountain site, and even if it were to open, its capacity cannot contain all the high-level waste that would exist. Could wastes remain in Utah because there is no place else to take them? We oppose both short-term storage and the likelihood of this becoming long-term.**
- 4. Impacts of transportation accidents and the equipment and costs needed to respond**



are not adequately considered. It is not enough to simply say that there has never been an accident before.

5. PFS' financial responsibility and liability are not addressed. As a limited liability corporation, PFS and the eight nuclear utility member companies forming it would not be held financially liable for any problems that might develop at the Skull Valley dump site. If PFS and its member companies are so confident in the safety of their proposal, why are they so reluctant to back it up with financial assurance?

The bottom line is the proposed site would affect all of us in the Salt Lake Valley and not only the Goshute Indian people whose land it would be located on. Why should we all accept the risks and worry of this facility when only the Goshutes who are desperate for money are willing. We have already been "down wind" of more than our share of hazardous waste facilities, and both leaders and citizens are strongly opposed. If temporary storage is so safe, then high level nuclear waste, generated in another part of the country, can stay where it is. There is no reason dry cask storage cannot be used at the reactor sites where the waste is currently located, thus eliminating the possibility of transportation accidents.

The proposed site is in a seismic zone.


Waste shipped by train or truck pose a real possibility of train de-railments or truck accidents.
