SUBJECT: RESPONSE TO YOUR OCTOBER 6, 2000 LETTER

Dear Mr. Parkyn:

I am responding to your October 6, 2000, letter to U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Chairman Richard A. Meserve. In your letter, you expressed your opposition to a request from one of Utah's United States Senators, Robert Bennett, for a 120-day extension to the public comment period for NUREG-1714, "Draft Environmental Impact Statement for the Construction and Operation of an Independent Spent Fuel Storage Installation on the Reservation of the Skull Valley Band of Goshute Indians and the Related Transportation Facility in Tooele County, Utah." (DEIS). Several other requests were also received for extensions of various lengths of time. The NRC staff, in consultation with the U.S. Bureau of Land Management, the U.S. Bureau of Indian Affairs, and the Surface Transportation Board (the three Federal agencies cooperating with NRC in the development of this Environmental Impact Statement) agreed that the 90-day public comment period provided was sufficient. Therefore, the public comment period ended on September 21, 2000, as scheduled. To the extent possible, the NRC staff has accommodated comments that were received after that date. The comments are now being considered by the NRC staff and the three cooperating Federal agencies. Our goal remains the completion of the Final EIS by the end of February 2001.

I trust this responds to your concerns.
