This letter confirms our plans to conduct two meetings with you and your staff to discuss three inspection findings identified at the Kewaunee Nuclear Power Plant. The first meeting is scheduled to begin at 10:00 a.m. (CST) on Tuesday, January 30, 2001. This meeting will discuss the facts and risk significance associated with the potential White finding relating to the auxiliary feedwater strainer issue addressed in Inspection Report No. 50-305/2000-012.

The second meeting is scheduled to begin at 1:30 p.m. (CST) on the same date. This meeting will discuss the facts and risk significance of the potential White finding concerning the Emergency Response Organization augmentation drill issues addressed in Inspection Report No. 50-305/2000-015. Additionally, the root cause and corrective actions for the Yellow finding associated with the Yellow Alert Notification System Reliability Performance Indicator, addressed in Inspection Report No. 50-503/2000-017, will be discussed.

Both meetings will be held in the Region III office in Lisle, Illinois and will be open to public observation.
