**COURSE:** Students will be expected to be present at the beginning of the workshop on Monday, April 2, 2001 at 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The Workshop will end at 12:00 noon on Friday April 6, 2001. Students will be required to complete casework assignments by working together with other students after class hours.

**LODGING & TRAVEL:** You should plan to arrive on Sunday, April 1, 2001 and depart on Friday, April 6, 2001. Participants must make their own lodging and travel arrangements.
