**Interagency Agreement Between
The Central Intelligence Agency
And
The Nuclear Regulatory Commission**

I. SCOPE OF THE AGREEMENT

BACKGROUND

In accordance with 10 CFR Part 10, the Personnel Security Branch, Division of Facilities and Security (PERSEC/DFS), requests, as needed, mental health evaluations of employees, consultants, contractors and licensee personnel to resolve security concerns involving emotional, mental and personality disorders.

OBJECTIVES

The CIA shall provide their staff psychologists and psychiatrists to conduct mental health evaluations, as needed, of NRC employees, consultants, contractors and licensee personnel in accordance with 10 CFR Part 10. Activities associated with these evaluations include coordinating the evaluation with NRC, reviewing the individual's Personnel Security File, conducting the mental health evaluation and providing NRC with a written report, which includes findings and a recommendation. NRC will request these evaluations to resolve security concerns involving emotional, mental and personality disorders.

The CIA also will provide training to PERSEC staff and conduct Personnel Security File reviews, as needed.

SCOPE OF WORK

Under this agreement, the CIA will conduct evaluations at their facility in McLean, VA; at the NRC facility in Rockville, MD; or at another location (e.g., Regional Office or licensee facility), as agreed upon. When an evaluation is required, NRC will call the CIA to schedule the evaluation and to provide pertinent biographical data. NRC will subsequently forward to the CIA for review prior to the evaluation a copy of the individual's Personnel Security File, which may include the background investigation, case analysis, and interview transcript and analysis, if applicable. The CIA will conduct the mental health evaluation and will provide NRC with a written report of its findings and recommendation.

The CIA will conduct file reviews, as requested, to assess security issues, determine the necessity for a mental health evaluation and recommend further personnel security actions. This professional consultation is advisory in nature and does not obligate or restrict NRC in their independent adjudication of security issues.

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The CIA will provide periodic training to PERSEC staff at the NRC Headquarters in Rockville, MD. This training will be related to the 13 criteria in the White House Adjudicative Guidelines.

ESTIMATED QUANTITY OF SERVICES REQUIRED PER YEAR

NRC expects to request approximately 15 mental health evaluations per year under this agreement. The CIA will charge NRC a flat fee of \$500 per case, which includes reviewing the case file provided by NRC, conducting the mental health evaluation and preparing a written report.

NRC expects to request approximately 10 file reviews per year under this agreement. The CIA will charge \$75 per hour for these reviews.

The CIA will provide approximately 10 hours of training per year (including travel time) related to the 13 criteria in the Adjudicative Guidelines. The CIA will charge \$50 per hour.

MEETINGS AND TRAVEL

Most of the evaluations are expected to be conducted at the CIA facility in McLean, VA. Occasionally, however, the CIA will conduct an evaluation at the NRC facility in Rockville, MD. In these cases, the CIA will be reimbursed for local government travel rates. It is possible that evaluations may occasionally be conducted at an NRC Regional Office or a licensee facility. If this occurs, the CIA will be reimbursed for government per diem and travel costs.

NRC-FURNISHED MATERIAL

Within 2 working days from the date NRC requests an evaluation, NRC will provide the CIA with the individual's Personnel Security File for review prior to the scheduled evaluation.

SCHEDULE AND/OR MILESTONES FOR DELIVERABLES

The CIA will schedule evaluations to take place within agreed upon locations and time-frames, but generally not to exceed 10 working days from the date of NRC's request.

The CIA will provide written reports of findings and recommendations to NRC within 7 working days from the date the evaluation was conducted.

The CIA will provide oral results of file reviews within 2 working days from the date the information was received.

QUALIFICATION OF PERFORMING PERSONNEL

A credentialed mental health professional (e.g., clinical psychologist or psychiatrist), employed by, acceptable to or approved by the U.S. Government, shall be utilized in evaluating potentially disqualifying and mitigating information fully and properly, and particularly for consultation with the individual's mental health care provider.

II. AUTHORITY

Authority to enter into this agreement is the Economy Act of 1932.

III. PERIOD OF AGREEMENT

The period of performance shall be for two years from the date of the agreement. This agreement may be extended or modified upon the agreement of both parties. Extensions or modifications of this agreement will be executed using a form mutually agreeable to both parties. Either party may terminate this agreement after providing 90 days written advance notice to the other party.

IV. AGENCY LIAISONS

The NRC designates the person named below as a "Technical Representative" to coordinate with the CIA regarding activities related to the services provided under this agreement, including placing orders for services from the CIA and monitoring the services provided.


VI. BILLING
