I am hereby formally requesting that the NRC provide a link to the Blue Ridge Environmental Defense League (BREDL) web site. I am suggesting a link directly to the BREDL Anti-Southern Plutonium Campaign site at <http://www.bredl.org/sapc/index.htm>.

At the present time, the MOX website has links to Government and Industry but not a single link to non-governmental agencies that oppose MOX. In the issue of fairness and impartiality on the part of NRC, BREDL recommends either providing links to nuclear watchdog groups or removing the links to the industry sites as listed:

Duke Cogema Stone & Webster -- A private corporation's website that provides a short discussion of DCS and new information on the MOX project.

COGEMA/BNFL -- A private corporation's website that discusses MOX fuel and the companies involved.

Duke Engineering Services -- A private corporation's website that provides general information on the company.

COGEMA, Inc. -- A private corporation's website that provides general information on the company.

Stone and Webster -- A private corporation's website that provides general information on the company.

Framatone ANP -- A private corporation's website that provides general information on the company.

Nuclear Fuel Services -- A private corporation's website that provides general information on the company and some discussion of their involvement in MOX.

The Amarillo National Resource Center (for Plutonium): A private website on research and information for nuclear weapons materials, which was developed by the Amarillo National Research Center, and sponsored by the Department of Energy, has several relevant fact sheets.

The inclusion of <http://www.pu.org> is particularly disturbing as this organization was formed to promote plutonium in Texas.
