AGENCY INFORMATION COLLECTION ACTIVITIES**

Dear Ms. Shelton:

Virginia Electric and Power Company (Dominion) appreciates the opportunity to provide comments on the continued approval of information collections under the provisions of the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995 (44 U. S. C. Chapter 35) which appeared in the Federal Register, Vol. 65, No. 242, on December 15, 2000, page 78515.

We have reviewed the specific questions you asked and submit the following comments for your consideration.

1. Is the proposed collection of information necessary for the NRC to properly perform its function? Does the information have practical utility?
  - Yes, the information summarizes information on radioactive waste in a standard format.
  - Standardization of the shipping manifest is of value to the utility.
2. Is the burden estimate accurate?
  - Yes.
3. Is there a way to enhance the quality, utility, and clarity of the information to be collected?
  - There is no reason to make any changes to the forms. We are comfortable with completing the forms as currently formatted.

4. How can the burden of the information collection be minimized, including the use of automated collection techniques or other forms of information technology?


