Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) hereby withdraws its applications, dated March 2, 2001, seeking the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's consent, pursuant to 10 CFR 50.80, to the proposed indirect transfer of control of Turkey Point Nuclear Plant, Units 3 and 4 and St. Lucie Nuclear Plant, Units 1 and 2 (FPL Letter L-2001-024) and to the proposed direct transfer of control of FPL's nuclear plants (FPL Letter L-2001-036).

The proposed license transfers were to occur as a result of the merger between FPL Group, Inc. (FPL Group) and Entergy Corporation (Entergy). The reason for the withdrawal of these applications is the termination of the merger agreement between FPL Group and Entergy.
