Gentlemen:

Enclosed are amendments to all the Eastman Kodak Company, Kodak Park Works byproduct material licenses. These amendments combine into three licenses the byproduct material coverage of the 18 licenses previously in effect at Kodak Park Works.

These three licenses are generally categorized into three areas of byproduct material uses: (1) Laboratory and experimental; (2) industrial testing; and (3) domestic light sources, respectively, as follows:

- (1) License No. 32-4661-21 combines License Nos. 32-4661-3, -3, -4, -5, -7, -8, -9, -14, -16, -17, -18, -19, and -21 and also includes 25 milliwatts of balance 75 and a 100 milliwatt incandescent 241 sealed source as you requested in recent byproduct material application.
- (2) License No. 32-4661-20 combines License Nos. 32-4661-6, -13, -15, and -20.
- (3) License No. 32-4661-10 has only been amended to extend the expiration date.

All other licenses have been terminated by enclosed amendments. The Commission has combined your licenses as a convenience in administering to your present and future byproduct material needs.

You will note that Condition No. 16 of License No. 32-4661-21, Condition No. 17 of License No. 32-4661-20, and Condition No. 15 of License No. 32-4661-10 state the documents that contain the pertinent provisions, equipment, etc. which must be in effect at Eastman Kodak Company for conduct of your byproduct material program under the three enclosing

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Moreover, should the above-referenced conditions sub administration of your hypodermat material program embowens, it is suggested that you submit, in line of those referenced applications and letters, an updated application consolidating information on the facilities radiation detection equipment radiological safety procedures the control functions and responsibilities of the Radiation Protection Committee, the procedures by which those functions are carried out and the radiation experience and training of Committee members; methods of waste disposal and PDA badge, dosimeter, and bioassay procedures now in effect at the Kodak East West. Such an application would also clarify to the Committee your overall radiological procedures and their implementation for safe conduct of your hypodermat material program, which would assist in satisfying the time required for processing future applications for embowens.
