



The DEIS fails to adequately address the need, or lack thereof, to monitor water quality at or near the proposed facility, for the purpose of determining if the facility is in fact affecting water quality. Various types of hazardous waste treatment, storage and disposal facilities must have extensive groundwater monitoring systems. Even corner gasoline service stations are required to have some type of groundwater monitoring systems to comply with their release detection requirements. In my professional opinion, it is not only reasonable, it is essential, that the PFS nuclear waste facility have in place groundwater monitoring to monitor water quality.


