SYNOPSIS

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region II, Office of Investigations, initiated this investigation on September 17, 2001, to determine if a Burns International Security Service officer assigned to the Tennessee Valley Authority, Sequoyah Nuclear Plant, was discriminated against for engaging in protected activity.

The evidence developed during this investigation did not substantiate that the security officer was passed over for engaging in protected activity.
