CHAIRMAN MESERVE: Good afternoon ladies and gentlemen. This is an affirmation session. I understand we have two items to come before us this afternoon. Madam Secretary, will you proceed?

MS. VIETTI-COOK: The Commission is being asked to act on a Memorandum and Order responding to Georgians Against Nuclear Energy (GANE) petition for interlocutory Commission review of the Licensing Board's denial of GANE's motion that the proceeding be dismissed or held in abeyance on the ground that the NRC's contemplated two-step proceeding is incompatible with 10 CFR Part 70. The Commission has voted to approve a Memorandum and Order which grants GANE's petition for review and, on review, affirms the Board's decision. The Memorandum and Order also denies as moot GANE's motion for a stay of the proceedings pending review. Would you please affirm your votes.
