NRC STAFF'S RESPONSE TO THE MOTION
OF THE NUCLEAR ENERGY INSTITUTE
FOR LEAVE TO FILE AN AMICUS BRIEF

On February 27, 2002, the Nuclear Energy Institute ("NEI") filed a motion for leave to file a brief *amicus curiae*,¹ along with its proposed brief,² in response to the Commission's Orders of February 6, 2002, requesting briefs from the parties in four separate adjudicatory proceedings.³ NEI's Motion seeks leave to file a brief concerning an issue that is now under review by the Commission -- *i.e.*, whether the Commission's responsibility under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 ("NEPA") requires consideration of intentional malevolent acts, such as those

directed against the United States on September 11, 2001. The NRC Staff ("Staff") herewith responds to NEI's Motion.

In the Staff's view, NEI's Motion establishes that the issue under review by the Commission is of concern to NEI's members and to the nuclear energy industry, in general. In addition, it is apparent that the Commission's resolution of this issue may affect NEI's members' interests, in that the issue appears to have generic applicability to NRC licensees and license applicants other than those involved in the instant proceeding, and the resolution of this issue could affect other licensing proceedings in the future. Accordingly, the Staff does not object to NEI's filing of its *amicus* brief relating to this issue in the instant proceeding.
