SUBJECT: NRC REVIEW OF LOST Polonium-210 STATIC ELIMINATOR

Dear Mr. Kiedrowski:

This refers to conversations between NRC staff and Marjorie Oaks of your staff concerning a lost static eliminator (NRD Mod P2021) containing a nominal 10 millicuries of Polonium-210.

The NRC has determined that a violation of 10 CFR 31.5 occurred when Spartek lost a Polonium-210 static eliminator which was last seen about February 1, 2002.

In accordance with the NRC's Interim Enforcement Policy for Generally Licensed Devices, the NRC is exercising discretion and therefore, is not issuing enforcement action for the violation because the violation was not willful. Spartek identified and reported the violation to the NRC, and Spartek took appropriate corrective action to address the violation and to prevent reoccurrence of similar problems. However, any future violations of 10 CFR 31.5 may be considered for enforcement action.
