Dear Sir,

I am a resident of Nashville and am very concerned about the possibility of a uranium enrichment plant in Nashville, upriver from Nashville.

I have unfortunate experience of the Uranium Corporation, which is part of the Louisiana Energy Service partnership. I lived in Pakistan and taught at the International School for the U.S. State Dept. at the time when Prof. Abdul Qadeer Khan took Uranium technology back to Pakistan.

This was the foundation of the Pakistani bomb project, which in turn was largely responsible for the North Korean bomb project.

(Later, a German employee of Urenco sold nuclear secrets to Iraq.) Urenco's parent company, BNFL, is known throughout the world for lax safety and security controls.

In this age of terrorism and nuclear proliferation, I feel strongly that Tennessee should have nothing to do with the Urenco Corporation or with BNFL.

I have not been given any information to convince me that this plant would be useful to our region or to the nation as a whole. But it would present great safety and security risks.

Please do not allow this plant to be built! Thanks for your consideration,
