NRC STAFF'S UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR
SUPPLEMENTAL CORRECTIONS TO THE
TRANSCRIPT FOR THE EVIDENTIARY HEARING
ON UNIFIED CONTENTION UTAH L/QQ

The NRC Staff ("Staff") hereby requests that the supplemental proposed corrections set forth in the Table attached hereto be made to the transcript of the evidentiary hearings on Unified Contention Utah L/QQ. The attached table lists additional corrections that the Staff has identified in its further review of the transcript, which were not set forth in the "Proposed Joint Corrections" to the transcript filed jointly by Applicant Private Fuel Storage, L.L.C. ("Applicant" or "PFS"), the State of Utah ("State") and the Staff on December 6, 2002.

The Staff previously identified errors in the transcript of the evidentiary hearings on Unified Contention Utah L/QQ, which were set forth among the parties' Proposed Joint Corrections of December 6, 2002. The Licensing Board adopted those proposed corrections in its "Order Regarding Evidentiary Record and Timing of Decision," dated December 11, 2002 (at 5). In that Order, the Licensing Board identified steps allowing for the formal closing of the evidentiary record in this proceeding, and further instructed the parties to bring to the Board's attention any "additional measures" that "must be taken . . . to put the record in a proper state" (*Id.* at 5-6). In accordance with that Order, the Staff has identified the additional proposed transcript corrections set forth in

the attached Table, which it wishes to bring to the Licensing Board's attention in order to assure that the record correctly reflects the testimony and is readily understandable.

Consistent with the approach followed by the parties in their Proposed Joint Corrections (as reflected in the Board's Order of December 11, 2002, at 5), given the size of the transcript, the Staff has not attempted to undertake a comprehensive identification and listing of every potential correction to the transcript, and has not sought to identify and correct obvious typographical or spelling errors. Further, the Staff is aware of no contested issue of fact whose resolution turns on a proposed correction to the transcript.

Counsel for the Staff has discussed the proposed changes in the attached Table with Counsel for the State and Counsel for PFS. Neither of those parties object to these additional proposed corrections.

CONCLUSION

For the reasons set forth above, the Staff respectfully submits that the supplemental proposed corrections set forth in the Table attached hereto be made to the transcript of the evidentiary hearings on Unified Contention Utah L/QQ.
