**GEORGIANS AGAINST NUCLEAR ENERGY'S REQUEST FOR EXTENSION  
AND PROPOSED SCHEDULE FOR RESPONSES TO DCS  
SUMMARY DISPOSITION MOTION ON CONTENTIONS 1 AND 2**

Georgians Against Nuclear Energy ("GANE") hereby requests an extension of the time for responding to Duke Cogema Stone & Webster's Motion for Summary Disposition on Contentions 1 and 2 (May 9, 2003). GANE requests a one-week extension of the twenty-day period permitted by 10 C.F.R. § 2.749, because GANE's counsel will be out of town during most of the week of May 19, 2003; and because the following week, she must defend the deposition of Glenn Carroll on May 29. GANE has consulted with counsel for Duke Cogema Stone & Webster ("DCS"), and the U.S. Nuclear Commission ("NRC") Staff, who do not oppose this request.

Pursuant to instructions issued by the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board ("ASLB") during a telephone conference on May 13, 2003, GANE, DCS, and the Staff

have also consulted regarding a schedule for the NRC Staff's response to DCS's motion, GANE's reply to the NRC Staff's response to the motion, and DCS's reply to GANE's response. Our proposal is as follows:

- June 5: GANE and NRC Staff respond to DCS's summary disposition motion
- June 16: DCS replies to GANE's response, GANE replies to new facts or arguments in NRC Staff's response

Under this schedule, the ASLB will have all summary disposition pleadings in hand before Judge Moore returns to his office on June 17.
