SUBJECT: Revision to Response to Compensatory Measure B.2.c of the Interim Safeguards and Security Compensatory Measures Order

In accordance with 10 CFR 50.4, Omaha Public Power District (OPPD) hereby submits information in response to the Order for Interim Safeguards and Security Compensatory Measures (hereinafter "Order") issued by the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) on February 25, 2002 (Reference 2). This submittal supersedes and revises the information provided in Reference 3 with respect to Interim Compensatory Measure (ICM) B.2.c. This submittal does not alter the information provided in OPPD's Answer to the Order (References 4 and 5).

In Reference 3, OPPD provided its response to Reference 2 for Fort Calhoun Station Unit No. 1 (FCS). In Reference 3, FCS stated in its response to Interim Compensatory Measure (ICM) B.2.c that an interim compensatory protective device had been installed at Gate 1. FCS has a relatively small protected area in comparison to other nuclear power stations. Movement of large/heavy equipment is complicated due to the difficulty of maneuvering within such a small

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protected area. Certain routes for moving heavy equipment cannot be utilized due to the presence of underground piping. Therefore, OPPD plans to utilize Gate 1 as an operational access point to the protected area, in addition to the currently operational Sally Port access point, and plans to remove the interim compensatory protective device from Gate 1. This is being done to facilitate equipment delivery and removal within the FCS protected area. Additionally, analysis performed in response to Reference 6 supports the removal of this interim compensatory protective device. All of the requirements of ICM B.2.c remain met.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct and copies of the response were sent to the addressee and listed individuals. (Executed on August 21, 2003).
