MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

Dear Ms. Jefferson:

I am responding to an August 11, 2003, letter from Ruth Ehinger, New Jersey Coastal Program Manager, regarding a program change in the New Jersey Coastal Management Program. The New Jersey legislation prescribes an effects level of polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) in worms, beyond which the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection cannot permit or authorize the transport of dredged material for the purpose of disposing it in the state waters of the Atlantic Ocean. Any comments concerning whether the program change constitutes a routine program change were to be directed to you. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission has no comments.
