SUBJECT: CFC Logistics, Inc. License Application

Dear Mr. Sugarman:

Your letter dated August 15, 2003 (ML032320042), requests that the NRC Staff deny or withhold decision on the license application of CFC Logistics, Inc., then pending before the Staff. As you know, we issued a license to CFC Logistics on August 27, 2003. A copy of the license is available at ML032390341 in the NRC's Electronic Reading Room at [www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html](http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html) and was included with my August 29, 2003, letter. The Staff gave consideration that was appropriate under the circumstances to the points raised in your letter.

Your letter contains various points in support of your request. The following is the Staff's response to those points.

Your first point concerns a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Request. The documents you discussed were provided with my letter to you dated August 29, 2003 (ML032410410, not publically available).

You next requested the opportunity to review the CFC filing in response to our letter of July 18, 2003, and indicated you had not been able to locate the document on our web site. The document which directly responds to that request is dated July 22, 2003 and is ML032030333 in the NRC's Electronic Reading Room. This document was also provided with my August 29, 2003 letter.

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In closing you referred to the areas of concern discussed in your request for a hearing on this matter and request a meeting to discuss the various matters. The Staff held a public meeting on August 21, 2003 in Quakertown, Pennsylvania regarding the CFC Logistics, Inc. application, which you attended. Your remaining points were issues that your clients had already raised or could raise before the Presiding Officer. Raising those issues before the Presiding Officer was the appropriate forum for those issues.
