Re: Freedom of Information Act Request

To Whom It May Concern:

Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. §552 et seq. ("FOIA"), I am requesting records of correspondence and other information requested by or provided to the following individuals and their staff

- **Wesley K. Clark**, from 1983 – present, specifically
 - From 1983 – 2000, during which he was an officer in the United States Army
 - From 2000 – present
- **Howard B. Dean** from 1982 – present, specifically:
 - From 1982-86, during which he was a candidate for and member of the VT House of Representatives
 - From 1986-1991, during which he was a candidate for and the elected Lt. Governor of Vermont
 - From 1991-2003, during which he was a candidate for and the elected Governor of Vermont
 - 2003-present, during which he is an announced candidate for the Democratic nomination to be President of the United States
- **Richard A Gephardt**, from 1971 – present, specifically:
 - 1971-76, during which he was a member of the St. Louis Board of Alderman
 - 1977 – present, during which he has been a candidate for and a member of the US House of Representatives
- **John F. Kerry**, from 1984-present, specifically:
 - 1982-84, during which he was a candidate for and the Lt. Governor of Massachusetts
 - 1984-present, during which he was a candidate for and a member of the United State Senate

I seek all direct correspondence between the listed individuals or their staff and your agency, including letters, reports, requests and other relevant material. I am not seeking any secondary material such as phone logs, e-mails, notations of conversations etc. In the event that that the agency maintains logs or databases of correspondence between the above offices and the agencies, I would be willing to receive a listing of the date of the correspondence, who the correspondence is from, who it is directed to, and the subject matter of the correspondence.

To the extent that the above information is available in electronic format, I would be willing to receive that information on computer disk or CD-ROM, particularly if providing the information in this format reduces the time or expense involved. Otherwise, I would expect to receive the information in paper form.

Congress wrote the Freedom of Information Act so that the American people, who do not have the power of subpoena, are guaranteed a broad right to know about the operations and activities of their government and its officials, consistent with personal privacy. Therefore, please release any material that may be reasonably separated and released, as provided by Agency rules in the Code of Federal Regulations. In particular, information regarding individuals (other than the public officials listed in this request) should be redacted where disclosure would be an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy. [Per the exemption provided by Congress in 5 U.S.C. 552(b)(6)]


I also request that identify each document that falls with scope of this request but is withheld from release and that you provide the specific legal grounds for withholding documents or portions of documents.
