> Subject: Procedure Change to Address SHPO Issues

> We have started the review process for changing the Environmental
> Evaluation procedure to address some concerns related to historical and
> archeological properties. It is not anticipated that this review cycle
> will last long.

>

> This procedure, as currently written, says that when disturbing ground at
> locations not previously disturbed, precautionary measures shall be taken
> to ensure that sites listed or eligible for listing in the National
> Register of Historic Places are not impacted. The evaluator is to review
> the FES-OL and supplements, FES-CP, Environmental Report to the NRC and
> supplements, and/or Appendix B to Technical Specifications to obtain
> information pertaining to the archeological significance of the location
> when ground will be disturbed. If the document review indicates the NRC
> has previously evaluated the location when ground will be disturbed as not
> significant, then no further action is needed. Otherwise, the reviewer is
> to contact the State Historic Preservation Office for guidance on how to
> proceed prior to initiating the ground disturbance.
