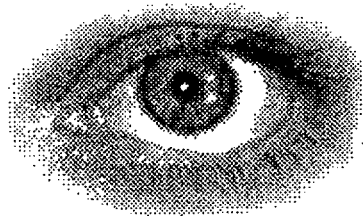
Dear Mr. Caldwell,

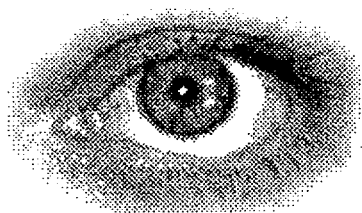
Dear Mr. Caldwell,

As a Ohio resident and tax payer I am concerned with he public safety issues revolving around David Beesse power plant.

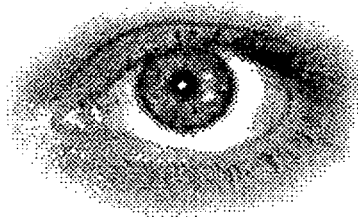
Note: I am not against nuclear, and I do want the power companies to deliver a Quality service at the most reasonable cost to consumers (tax payers) .

My husband and I are residents of [REDACTED] Ohio, and are therefore concerned over events that impact Northeast Ohio to such a degree as the recent scandalous discoveries at Davis-Besse Nuclear Plant. While no actual disaster took place, the threat was much too close for comfort. It is certainly true that nuclear power plants have been effectively used for some period of time with little environmental impact. However, it seems that this has led to a lessening of control and safety efforts. Quality and safety testing do not increase profits for energy companies, and it may have become difficult for the NRC to maintain strict requirements over plants with clean records. However, the NRC's responsibility to the public must continue to be its first priority. I encourage you to keep the Davis-Besse plant closed until such time as its safe operation can be absolutely assured. In addition, I feel that the findings at Davis-Besse should inspire the NRC to re-investigate all functioning plants for signs of dangerous wear. Your immediate response to the Davis-Besse situation is required. On behalf of my friends and family, I thank you for your continued concern for public safety.

The location of the plant itself is cause for concern—a densely populated region with millions of people.

My family and I live north of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, along the shore of Lake Michigan. It might seem like a long way from Davis-Besse, but it's not. We're connected by the Great Lakes, the largest bodies of fresh water in the world. We dare not put this irreplaceable resource, and the lives of millions of people, in jeopardy.

Yet Davis-Besse remains the most dangerous nuclear plant in America. In February 2002, it came closer to a nuclear meltdown than any U.S. plant since Three Mile Island. Fifteen months later, none of the top managers have been replaced, and the company's own investigation shows continued widespread intimidation of workers who discover safety problems.



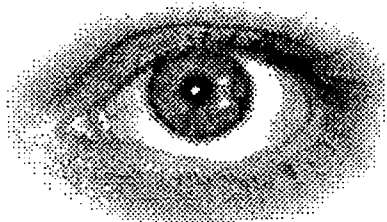
DEAR SIR:

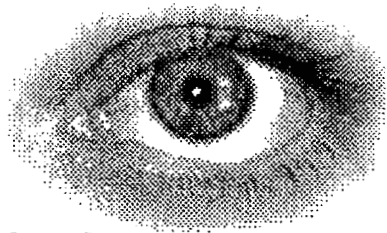

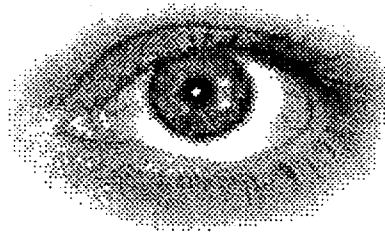

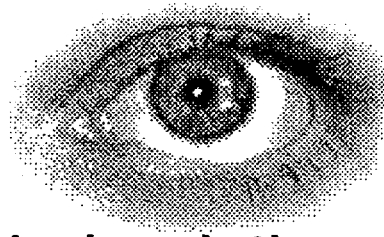
