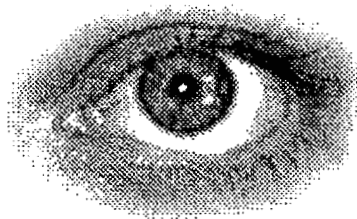
Dear Mr. Caldwell,

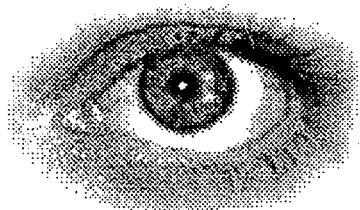
Mr Caldwell:

I came to live in the [REDACTED] area in 1977. Since that time I have always heard about the Davis-Besse reactor and its troubles of one kind or another. I was not surprised when I heard about the pineapple size hole in the steel shield. But I was shocked when the First Energy proposed to repair the hole by welding.

One can understand why First Energy was negligent about the operation of the reactor. Nobody should be surprised if one hears that a tiger or a lion killed a cow. First Energy is in the business of making money for mostly for the upper management who never live near the reactor, and a little bit for the shareholders.
