Dear Chairman Diaz:

I would like to bring to your attention many scientific concerns and apparent actions of a reply despite my communication of these concerns to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission in the past two years. I have brought to your attention scientific concerns about risk assessment particularly for complex mixtures. The NRC is expected to receive a license application for Yucca Mountain Repository from the Department of Energy by the end of December 2004. How can the NRC evaluate this application in the absence of credible scientific information on the possible adverse effects of complex mixtures on human health in light of recent developments and publications which are challenging the acceptable historical approach to risk (bystander effects).

I am sending a copy of this letter to the Nevada Congressional Delegation for their information and appropriate action. I will be away for the next two weeks, and hope to receive a reply for the NRC upon my return. It is my opinion that a collaborative agreement of all parties is the approach to resolve this issue.
