PUBLIC INVITED TO JOIN NUCLEAR WASTE DISCUSSION

(Olympia)--The Washington Nuclear Waste Advisory Council invites the public to join in group discussions on nuclear waste issues at a joint meeting of Washington's Advisory Council and Oregon's Hanford Advisory Committee. The meeting will be held on Thursday, March 19, 7 p.m., at the First Presbyterian Church, 4300 North Main Street, Vancouver, Washington.

Discussion groups at the meeting will focus on four topics: geology and hydrology, public involvement, site characterization and socioeconomic impacts.

"We want to encourage active citizen participation in the discussion groups and encourage coordination between Oregon and Washington on nuclear waste issues", said Phyllis Clausen, Vancouver area Nuclear Waste Advisory Council member. Arno Denecke, Chair of Oregon's Hanford Advisory Committee added, "This is a chance for the public to talk to experts and advise us on how the two states can work more closely together."

Clausen also said that a slide presentation will be shown at 6:30 p.m. at the First Presbyterian Church for persons interested in gaining a basic understanding of Hanford and nuclear waste issues.

Both the Washington Nuclear Waste Advisory Council and Oregon Hanford Advisory Committee will conduct regular meetings prior to the joint meeting at the First Presbyterian Church. These separate meetings will begin at 1 p.m. and 2 p.m., respectively. The meetings are open to the public.

This is the second in a series of joint meetings between Washington's Advisory Council and Oregon's Committee. The last meeting held in June 1986, focused on the review of radioactive defense waste issues.

The 15-member Washington Nuclear Waste Advisory Council represents citizens and local officials who advise the Nuclear Waste Board on all aspects of Washington's nuclear waste program. The Advisory Council concentrates on informing and involving the public. The Washington Nuclear Waste Board's 15 members are state officials and legislators who track the federal government's nuclear waste disposal activities and make recommendations related to the state's nuclear waste management policies.

Oregon's Hanford Advisory Committee has 32 members representing public interest groups, elected officials, state boards and commissions, and industry. The committee was formed to protect Oregonians' health, safety, and environment.
