SIERRA CLUB ET AL.'S MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME  
TO FILE APPLICATION FOR STAY OF ISSUANCE  
OF SECOND LICENSE AMENDMENT TO NFS

Petitioners, the State of Franklin Group of the Sierra Club, Friends of the Nolichucky River Valley, Oak Ridge Environmental Peace Alliance, and Tennessee Environmental Council hereby request an extension of one business day for filing an application to stay the Nuclear Regulatory Commission ("NRC" or "Commission") Staff's issuance of Amendment 47 to Nuclear Fuel Services' ("NFS's") license for its facility in Erwin, Tennessee. The NRC Staff issued the amendment on January 13, 2004.<sup>1</sup> The license amendment is the second of three license amendments for NFS's proposed Blended Low Enrichment Uranium ("BLEU") Project, under which NFS would convert high-enriched uranium ("HEU") to blended low-enriched uranium ("BLEU").

NRC regulation 10 C.F.R. § 2.1263 provides that an application for a stay of a Staff decision to issue a license must be filed within ten days of "the staff's action."

While the Staff's action occurred on January 13, Petitioners did not receive notice of the Staff's action until 6:00 p.m. on Friday, January 16, when the Staff sent Board Notification 2004-02 via e-mail.<sup>2</sup> Because the e-mail arrived after Petitioners' counsel had left the office for the weekend, she did not learn of the Staff's action until Monday, January 19.

Petitioners are filing this application within ten days of the posting of Board Notification 2004-02 on the e-mail service list, and within seven days of actually learning of the license amendment. Thus, this application is timely in relation to the date when notice was received. Petitioners' counsel was not able to file the stay motion by the due date, January 23, due to major obligations in other cases.<sup>3</sup> Therefore Petitioners request that the Presiding Officer exercise his discretion, as permitted by 10 C.F.R. § 2.711, to allow the filing of this stay application one business day late.

Petitioners's counsel has consulted counsel for NFS, who stated that NFS intends to oppose this motion. Petitioners' counsel also attempted to contact counsel for the NRC Staff, but was unable to reach her.
