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

On November 9, 2004, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission ("NRC" or "Commission") issued immediately effective orders in the captioned matter entitled Order Modifying License (Effective Immediately) ("Order") to Exelon Generation Company, LLC ("Exelon"). The Orders stated the Commission determined that independent spent fuel storage installations be required to implement additional security measures to address the current threat environment. The NRC stated it was imposing requirements as set forth in Attachment 1 of each Order.¹ Exelon has responded to the substantive requirements of the Orders by letters dated November 29, 2004, in accordance with the provisions of 10 CFR 72.4, as directed by the Orders.
