Subject: Closure of the hospital		
<p>Summary:</p> <p>An announcement was made on Wednesday, March 9, 2005 that the Women's Medical Hospital would be closing. A telephone call was made to Mr. Lambert on 3-10-05 to discuss their plan of action for the closure of the Nuclear Medicine and Radiology Departments. According to Mr. Lambert, all of the sealed sources remain at the facility and all orders for RAM have been stopped. As of Saturday (3-12-05) the hospital will no longer be accepting new patients. All of the other patients will be transferred to other hospitals in the area. The plan is to visit the facility on Friday (3-11-05) and verify that all sealed sources are secured. They will begin to research options for disposing of or transferring the sources. A close-out survey will be done after the sources/waste are transferred. Mr. Lambert expects to submit an NRC Form 314 by March 18, 2005.</p> <p>Another area that needs to be addressed by the licensee is the pacemaker license. The pacemaker license was transferred to the Women's Medical Hospital from MCP after the sale. Initially there were two licenses, one with MCP and one with Hahnemann. At some point they were combined and made an MCP license. The two patients that are still being monitored were initially on the Hahnemann license. Mr. Lambert would like to convince Hahnemann to take the license and follow the patients. P. Henderson agreed that that would be the best solution.</p>
