Subject: Storage of Material at Temporary Job sites			
<p>Summary:</p> <p>Mr. Lanier called me to inform that they have a job at a temporary job site in Montana, and this will require for us to store sealed sources on site over weekend. He asked me if they needed special permission or facilities to store the material at the plant over the weekend. He stated that they will coordinate the storage with the plant's safety staff. I asked him what types of sources they will store. He stated that these sources will be between 10 and 50 mCi of Cs-137 and/or 100 mCi of Co-60. I told him that their license authorizes the use of licensed material at temporary job sites and I do not think that it prohibits them from storing licensed material temporarily if the job is continuing the following working days. However, the storage location must be secure because security of licensed material is of utmost importance. I also told him that they need to make sure that the plant staff is fully aware of stored radioactive material as well as to ensure that the radiation levels around the storage location are within the regulatory limits.</p> <p>He stated that in his opinion, storage at plant site is more secure than in a hotel room or on the trucks, and that they will make sure that the plant's personnel are made aware of storage of licensed material and that Tru-Tec remains in control of storage area.</p>
