<b>Subject:</b> Request for a extension in response time.		
<p><u>Summary:</u> Mr. Davis stated that he has drafted a response to the NRC's Request for Additional Information, however, senior management is trying to determine whether the licensee should terminate the license. His management is discussing terms with the Army to see if the Army would remove the radioactive sources from the vehicles prior to the Army sending the vehicle to the licensee. If the Army is able to do this, then the licensee will request that the license be terminated. Mr. Davis stated that a decision would be made prior to June 17, 2005. He would notify me one way or the other prior to that date. I informed Mr. Davis that if the licensee decides to terminate the license, then he should look over the history of the license and determine if any of the tritium sealed sources ever were received in a damaged condition or were damaged prior to being sent back to the Army. If they were, then a final status survey would be required. If none of the sources were damaged, then a statement to that effect would be appropriate.</p>
