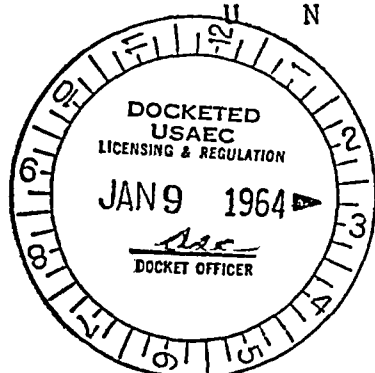

Dear Mr. Price:

Reference is made to the license application submittal of November 26, 1963, for United Nuclear's Scrap Recovery Facility located at Wood River Junction, Rhode Island, Docket No. 70-820.

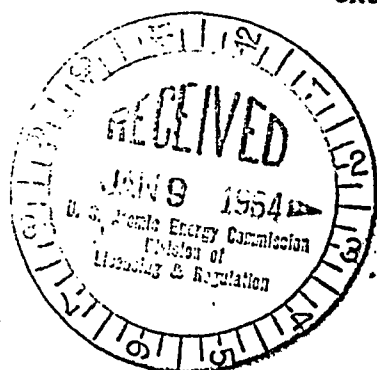
Request is hereby made to receive immediate and temporary license approval for storage only of pickle liquor at this site.

The following restrictions will apply:

- (a) The pickle liquor will be received and stored in 55-gallon drums in single layer height. Storage will be within a secured area at either the north or south side of the building and protected from vehicular traffic.
- (b) The liquor will have a uranium concentration of less than 2 grams of uranium 235 per liter. The liquor will also have a cadmium nitrate concentration equivalent to 1 gram cadmium nitrate per 1 gram of uranium 235.
- (c) The storage area will be monitored by a nuclear alarm system. Monitor Number 1 (North) or Number 4 (South) will be used.
- (d) The number of drums at the site at any one time is not to exceed 300.
