On October 18, 1995, you provided the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) with information that during July 1995 a ABB Combustion Engineering health physics technician was disciplined for falsification of records.

An evaluation of this issue will be conducted which I anticipate will take a minimum of 120 days to complete and I will inform you of the results upon completion. In resolving the issue, the NRC intends to take all reasonable efforts to not disclose your identity unless:

- (1) disclosure is necessary to ensure public health and safety,
- (2) disclosure is necessary to inform congress or State or Federal agencies in furtherance of NRC responsibilities under law or public trust,
- (3) you have taken actions that are inconsistent with and override the purpose of protecting your identity, or
- (4) for allegations involving wrongdoing (including harassment and intimidation), your identity may be disclosed at the NRC's discretion in order to pursue the investigation.
- (5) furthermore, you are not considered a confidential source unless formally granted in writing.

Let me assure you that every effort will be made to resolve your concerns. The U.S. NRC is responsible for protecting the public health and safety in the commercial uses of nuclear facilities and materials. We engage in major efforts on a daily basis to fulfill that responsibility.
