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PROGRAM SCOPE

The licensee was a private engineering/consulting firm and conducted licensed activities from two field offices. The licensee possessed one moisture/density gauge used daily for road construction projects during the construction season. The licensee approved five individuals (all successfully completed the manufacturer's training course) as authorized gauge users. The licensee did not perform any service or maintenance activities on its gauge; these services were performed by the manufacturer.

During this inspection, the inspector toured the gauge storage area, interviewed select licensee personnel, and reviewed select records. The inspection included a field inspection of one gauge user at a temporary job site. The inspector interviewed the gauge user and observed his use of personnel dosimetry, and surveillance/use/security of the gauge at the job site. The inspector also reviewed the shipping papers and performed surveys around the gauge transport container and the passenger compartment of the transport vehicle.
