The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff (the staff) and representatives of Nuclear Management Company, LLC (NMC) held a telephone conference call on October 6, 2005, to discuss and clarify the applicant's response to request for additional information (RAI), RAI 3.5.2.1.15-1, provided in a letter dated September 16, 2005, concerning the Monticello Nuclear Generating Plant license renewal application. The conference call was useful in clarifying the applicant's response. On the basis of the discussion, the applicant plans to submit a written response.
