ANSWER AND RESPONSE TO AUGUST 18, 2004, ISSUANCE OF ORDER FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF ADDITIONAL SECURITY MEASURES ASSOCIATED WITH ACCESS AUTHORIZATION FOR BROWNS FERRY NUCLEAR (BFN) PLANT, UNITS 1, 2, AND 3; AND SEQUOYAH NUCLEAR (SQN) PLANT, UNITS 1 AND 2 (EA-03-097)

Section IV of the subject Order states that, in accordance with 10 CFR §2.202, a licensee must submit an answer to the Order and may request a hearing on the Order within 20 days of the date thereof. This letter constitutes the answer (pursuant to 10 CFR 2.202 and Section IV) and response (pursuant to 10 CFR 50.4 and Sections III A.1, B.1 and B.2) of the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) to the Order.

TVA consents to the Order, and does not request a hearing.

On January 27, 2003, TVA responded to the January 7, 2003, Issuance of Order for Compensatory Measures Related to Access Authorization for power reactors for BFN, Units 1, 2, and 3; SQN, Units 1 and 2; and Watts Bar Nuclear Plant, Unit 1. One year later, by letter dated January 7, 2004, TVA confirmed full compliance with the January 7, 2003, Access Authorization Order.


