By statute, **NRC's** role is that of an independent regulator of any U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) proposal to construct and operate a geologic repository for disposal of HLW at Yucca Mountain, Nevada. NRC assures protection of public health and safety and the environment by thorough consideration of the DOE license application, if filed, as well as by enforcement of NRC regulations and relevant statutory requirements. NRC's role is separate and distinct from that of DOE, which is charged with developing, constructing, and managing any repository for disposal of HLW.
