Dear Mr. Bailey:

We have reviewed the proposed changes to the California regulations **17 CRR Sections 30345 to 30350, received by our office on December 16, 2005. These regulations** were reviewed by comparison to the equivalent Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) rules in 10 CFR Parts 34, 36, 39 and the requirements of the two amendments identified in the enclosed State Regulation Status (SRS) Data Sheet. We discussed our review of the regulations with Phillip Scott on January 12, 2006.

As a result of our review, we have three comments that have been identified in the enclosure. Please note that we have limited our review to regulations required for compatibility and/or health and safety. Under our current procedure, a finding that the California regulations meet the compatibility and health and safety categories of the equivalent NRC regulation may only be made based on a review of the final California regulations. However, we have determined that if your proposed regulations were adopted, incorporating our comments and without other significant change, they would meet the compatibility and health and safety categories established in the Office of State and Tribal Programs (STP) Procedure SA-200.

We request that when the proposed regulations are adopted and published as final regulations, a copy of the "as published" regulations be provided to us for review. As requested in STP Procedure SA-201, "Review of State Regulatory Requirements," please highlight the final changes and provide a copy to STP.

The SRS Data Sheet summarizes our knowledge of the status of other [State Name] regulations, as indicated. Please let us know if you note any inaccuracies, or have any comments on the information contained in the SRS Data Sheet. This requirement mandates that the licensee implemented abandonment before receiving NRC approval because the licensee believed there was an immediate threat to public health and safety; and the immediate threat to public health and safety justification for implementing abandonment if prior NRC approval was not obtained in accordance with paragraph (c)(1)(ii) of this section.</p> <p>California needs to add this paragraph to 17CRR§30350.3 to meet the Compatibility Category C designation assigned to Section 10 CFR §39.77(c)(1)(ii) and (d)(9).</p>
