One short-term contractor applying for unescorted access resulted in a refusal to test due to an initial low temperature sample followed by the individual refusing to remain in the collection area under observed conditions until acceptable sample could be obtained.

One short-term contractor for unescorted access resulted in a refusal to test due to a substituted sample with a temperature reading of 113°F. The individual did participate in an observed collection and provided a confirmed positive sample for THC.

One licensee employee random test resulted in a positive alcohol reading, 14 day denial of access and referral to the EAP.

FITNESS-FOR-DUTY PROGRAM SUMMARY

During the reporting period July 1 to December 31, 2005, the number of random tests performed was equivalent to the number required to test at an annual rate equal to at least 50 percent of the unescorted access population. The rate of positive results from random testing for this reporting period July 1 to December 31, 2005, was 0.42 percent. The annual rate of positive results from random testing for the calendar year 2005 was 0.13 percent.

POSITIVE RESULTS

One chemical test yielded a positive result during this reporting period. Calculated from the positives recorded from January 1990 until December 31, 2005, marijuana is the drug of preference, accounting for 61 percent of all the positive results; cocaine is second, yielding 17 percent of all the positive results.

MANAGEMENT ACTIONS

Pre-Access Testing

There was one pre-access test positive result during this reporting period. This was a result of confirmed positive following an attempt at substitution. The short-term contractor applicant provided an initial high out of range temperature sample measuring 113°F. The individual did remain under observation until a sample could be provided under observed conditions. The sample provided under observed conditions tested positive for marijuana. The MRO verified the positive test result and the sample substitution. Access to Energy Northwest property was denied for this individual for three years. Management was notified and the individual's files were annotated regarding the sample substitution, positive test result, termination for cause and management's actions.

There was one refusal to test during the pre-access testing process. The one short-term contractor applicant provided a low temperature specimen and refused to remain in the collection facility until an acceptable specimen could be provided under observed conditions. Access to Energy Northwest property was denied for this individual for three years. Management was notified and the individual's files were annotated regarding the refusal to test, termination for cause and management's actions.

Random Testing

There was one positive random test result during this reporting period.

Access was denied to one licensee employee for a minimum of fourteen days and the individual was referred to the Employee Assistance Program. The individual participated in a treatment program, provided evidence of rehabilitation and returned to work. The individual also regained unescorted access and is currently participating in a follow-up program.

Follow-Up Testing

There were no positive follow-up testing results during this reporting period.

Presently, there are two Energy Northwest employees participating in the follow-up program.

For-Cause/ Observable Behavior Testing

There were six for-cause tests administered due to observable behavior for five licensee employees and one long-term contractor employee during this reporting period. All six for-cause tests for observable behavior tested negative. The for-cause/observable behavior tests were administered after the following incidents:

- An Energy Northwest employee incorrectly inserted a control rod one notch when it should have been withdrawn during weekly control rod surveillance testing.
- An Energy Northwest employee incorrectly inserted a control rod one notch when it should have been withdrawn during weekly control rod surveillance testing.
- An Energy Northwest employee sent to support a USA outage was returned home, causing Columbia not to fulfill its commitment for personnel sharing.
- An Energy Northwest employee attempted to enter the protected area with potential contraband.
- An Energy Northwest employee was returning to work following a suspension for attempted entry of potential contraband into the protected area.
- A long-term contractor employee exhibited inappropriate behavior while operating a crane in an unsafe manner.

For-Cause/Post Accident Testing

There was one for-cause/post-accident test administered during this reporting period. The for-cause/post accident test was negative.

The for-cause/post-accident tests were administered after the following incident:

- An Energy Northwest employee was involved in a vehicle accident that involved damage to a security vehicle as the officer was departing the location of a security post east of the checkpoint.

No personal injuries were sustained as a result of the vehicle accident.

Return to Duty Testing

There was one return-to-duty test administered during this reporting period with negative results.

Other

Two chemical tests were administered in the other category. Other testing was conducted for two long-term contractor employees who had been inadvertently terminated from the unescorted access database and removed from the FFD random selection pool. The two individuals were not subject to one random selection conducted the period prior to discovery. No paperwork had been generated requesting termination. Upon discovery, the individual's names were immediately entered into the random test selection pool, and they were chemically tested under the category other, with negative results. This issue was entered into our corrective action process.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIONS

There were no administrative actions taken during this reporting period.

EVENTS REPORTED TO THE NRC

During this reporting period, there were no Fitness-For-Duty events that were reportable in accordance with 10 CFR 26.73.

PROGRAM WEAKNESSES:

No program weaknesses were identified during this reporting period.

PROGRAM CHANGES:

During this reporting period there were no Fitness-For-Duty program changes.
