This is in reference to your letter dated March 1, 2006 responding to our request for additional information. It was stated in your letter "Each individual listed has had a minimum of one year hands on (laboratory) experience using the radionuclides for which they are to be authorized". The renewed license, when completed, will list the individual authorized users **and** the isotopes for which they are authorized. In order to complete the license renewal submit the specific isotopes for which each authorized user is to be authorized to use.
