SUBJECT: FOUND LICENSED RADIOACTIVE MATERIAL

The Naval Radiation Safety Committee letter 5104 Ser N455C/N5U9011324 dated April 28, 2005 reported the loss of 27 chemical agent monitors (CAMs) and 11 automatic chemical agent detectors (ACADAs) which are authorized under Naval Radioactive Materials Permit No. 10-67004-T1NP. Subsequent investigations have located two of the CAMs (Serial numbers 14360 and 15360) and 11 of the ACADAs (Serial numbers 03858, 05272, 05377, 05476, 06151, 06177, 06701, 06768, 06802, 07408, and 07480) that were previously reported as missing. Naval Radioactive Materials Permit No. 10-67004-T1NP, issued under the authority of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission Master Materials License No. 45-23645-01NA, authorizes distribution and possession of the licensed material. Investigations are still in progress to locate the remaining 25 CAMs.
