Dear Dr. Diaz:

I am pleased to invite your nominations for the 2006 Roger W. Jones Award for Executive Leadership, hosted by the School of Public Affairs at American University. Now in its 28th year, the Roger W. Jones Award is given annually to two federal career executives who have demonstrated superior leadership in achieving their agency's mission and in providing for the continuity of government by developing other managers. The awards, including a \$2500 cash prize and a bronze plaque and citation, will be presented in a ceremony to be held on the campus of American University in the fall.

Among the many public service awards for government employees, the Roger W. Jones Award is unique in that it provides an opportunity for presidentially appointed leaders to honor exemplary career executives in their agencies. This award acknowledges that achieving the goals set by our elected officials, including the five government-wide goals of the President's Management Agenda, depends upon first-rate leadership by federal career executives.

Since 1978, 56 career executives in 24 departments and agencies have received the Roger W. Jones Award, and more than 500 have enjoyed the honor of being nominated. By nominating a career executive in your agency, you have an opportunity to tell the nominee and the other executives working with you how highly you value their contribution to good government.

A public servant of great distinction, Roger W. Jones served in a wide range of federal agencies over many years as a career executive and ultimately as a presidential appointee in both Republican and Democratic administrations. He exemplified a high standard of effective management, leading to organizational accomplishment and the development of administrative skills in the staffs of the agencies he served. Roger Jones recognized that efficiency of government depends largely on the quality of career executives who work with political leadership.

The enclosed brochure provides information for submitting nominations this year and also identifies the distinguished members of the Selection Committee. Nominations should include:

- (1) a brief biographical sketch including employment and significant awards (not to exceed two pages);
- (2) a narrative description of the nominee's superior leadership that resulted in outstanding organizational achievement, making clear the achievement's nature and significance and the career executives specific role (not to exceed three pages);
- (3) a narrative description of the nominee's strong commitment to effective continuity of government, through successful development of managers and executives, including the nominee's specific actions and success in institutionalizing the development of career executives and individual managers and executives (not to exceed three pages);
- (4) a signed cover letter from the head of the agency, or other appropriate administration appointee, recommending the nominee for the award.

Nominations should be submitted by June 16, 2006. Heads of departments and agencies will be notified of these award recipients in the fall of 2006. A copy of this letter, along with a brochure describing the award in more detail, has also been sent to your agency.

Thank you for taking the time to help us honor the senior federal executives whose career service

constitutes the core of our government's administrative departments and agencies. I look forward to receiving your nominations for the 2006 Roger W. Jones Award.
