SUMMARY OF INFORMATION COLLECTION REQUEST

Title: NRC Form 748, "National Source Tracking Transaction Report," Proposed New Form

Current Burden/Responses: None

Proposed Burden/Responses: 5,754 hours/2,781 responses
(NRC Licensees 1,496 hours/722 responses)
(Agreement State Licensees 4,258 hours/2,059 responses)

Frequency of Response: On occasion, initially

Reasons for Changes in Burden/Responses:

The rule, "National Source Tracking of High-Risk Sealed Sources," establishes a National Source Tracking System to track sources containing radioactive material of concern. The rule establishes a new NRC Form 748 that licensees may use to enter the data. Alternately, a licensee may enter the data on-line.

This information collection adds 5,754 hours burden (1,496 NRC Licensees + 4,258 Agreement State Licensees) and 2,781 responses (722 NRC Licensees + 2,059 Licensees) because this is a new form which had no previous burden. The burden cost per hour has been estimated at \$197/hr.

Abstract:

The final rule, 10 CFR Parts 20 and 32, "National Source Tracking of Sealed Sources," establishes a National Source Tracking System to track sources containing radioactive material of national concern. The system would provide greater source accountability by requiring that sources of concern be tracked from their manufacture to use, transfer, and final disposal. Licensees must initially enter all relevant source data and then update the data whenever a source is transferred or disposed of. The data for new sources are entered upon their manufacture. Licensees may complete NRC Form 748 or enter the data on-line.
