Dave,

I appreciate you conveying my letter to Hub. I didn't want to take a chance that his email address was something other than his initials or that he may be out of the office today. I trust you'll reach him.

I appreciate your and the NRC's thoroughness and dedication. I have been concerned, frankly, that I may have provided too much information/documentation and thus complicated and delayed the NRC's ability to take action.

I do take one exception with your response when you said, "The NRC is in the process of determining a course of action that will enable us to explore and validate whether the work environment at Artificial Island is in the state you describe."

Forget about me for a moment... [REDACTED] and dozens of anonymous people surveyed have described the work environment. They have done so, obviously, without realizing the NRC would ever hear their views. These candid, colloquial statements are compelling in and of themselves. I'm not sure what "validation" you seek or how many more people need to say similar things for you to be assured bold action is warranted.

I realize the far-reaching impacts of any course of action the NRC takes with PSEG. I trust the public, the industry, and the diligent employees of the utility will be well served.
